

GERRY BYRNE

Minister of Immigration, Population Growth and Skills



Gerry Byrne has had a long and successful career in federal politics, having served as the Member of Parliament for Humber – St. Barbe – Baie Verte beginning in 1996. Mr. Byrne was re-elected six times to the Parliament of Canada.

From 2002 until 2004, Mr. Byrne served as the Minister of State for the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency; the youngest cabinet member in Newfoundland and Labrador history. He was parliamentary secretary to several key cabinet members. He has also served in a lead role on a number of influential government standing committees.

Prior to entering politics, Mr. Byrne worked as an economic development officer on the Great Northern Peninsula, during which time he was involved in numerous projects from varying segments of the provincial economy, including the renewable and non-renewable resource sectors. He was born and raised in Corner Brook. Mr. Byrne completed his post-secondary education at Dalhousie University, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in biology.

Mr. Byrne was appointed Minister of Advanced Education and Skills on December 14, 2015, and Minister of Fisheries and Land Resources on July 31, 2017. He was appointed to serve as Minister of Immigration, Skills and Labour and Minister Responsible for Workplace NL in August 2020.

On April 8, 2021, he was sworn in as Minister of Immigration, Population Growth and Skills.

SCOTT PENNEY

Chief Executive Officer Port of Argentia



Mr. Penney was appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Port of Argentia in September 2020. The Port has seen tremendous growth in both the US offshore wind market as North America's first and only monopile marshalling port and the Argentia Renewables project positions the port to be the first mover of hydrogen in the global energy transition.

He serves as a Director of Argentia Capital Inc., a newly created subsidiary between the Port of Argentia and Torrent Capital. He holds a Bachelor of Commerce Degree, having graduated from Memorial University of Newfoundland in 1998. He started his career in the telecommunications industry, then joined former Premier, the Honorable Dwight Ball, as his Executive Assistant and later joined the Hebron Project at Bull Arm before moving to Pennecon to become General Manager of its Marine Division.

He has served as Chairman of the Board of the Bay Bulls - Bauline Athletic Association (BBBAA), a not-for-profit organization which provides after school and summer programs and overall recreation infrastructure investment to the seven communities the board represents. The BBBAA has invested over \$1M through its programming revenues, charitable fundraising events, and government funding initiatives.

Scott resides in Bay Bulls with his wife Jennifer and daughters Emma and Lauren.

MIKE RUDOFSKY

Director, CGS and WWRP Interface, Integration and SIMOPS, Cenovus Energy



Mike Rudofsky is a professional engineer with more than 15 years experience in the oil and gas industry, with expertise ranging from conceptual engineering and design to construction of facilities.

A graduate of Memorial University's mechanical engineering program in 2005, Mike later completed his Masters of Engineering Management at Memorial. Mike's career began when he joined IMV Projects in Calgary, first as a work term student and then supporting a variety of projects as a Project Engineer. He joined Cenovus (then Husky Energy) in 2008, holding a number of roles in the company's Developments team before joining the group that was beginning conceptual studies on what would eventually become the West White Rose Project.

Today, Mike is the Senior Manager, CGS on the West White Rose Project and is responsible for overseeing the engineering, construction and completion of the concrete gravity structure being constructed in Argentia, NL.

Andrew Short is the Chief Operating Office of Integrated Logistics. Starting as the first employee, he has grown to a team of 140, providing world-class stevedoring and marine logistics solutions across industries in the province.

After finishing his B.Comm at Memorial, Andrew began his career with the Business Development Bank of Canada. Here he first recognized the importance of our natural resource economy and learned directly from many of the province's leading business leaders. Combining the academic pursuit of his MBA in the evenings and bearing witness to real-life trials and clients during the day, his time in commercial finance set a foundation for the business practices he carries today.

In 2009 Andrew took what he calls "the natural career path from banking to stevedoring" with Integrated Logistics (IL). Trading "neckties for coveralls" in the early years, Andrew started at IL by leading from the hold of ships through all areas of the business. He has been a project manager for IL's scopes of work on our province's most significant industrial projects.

In 2012 Andrew led IL into Labrador with the establishment of the indigenous business Integrated Nunatsiavut Logistics with the Nunatsiavut Group of Companies. As the VP of Operations for INL, his friends and partners at NGC have expanded into marine chartering, heavy lift logistics, and flotel accommodations.




