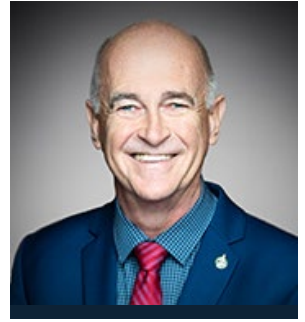

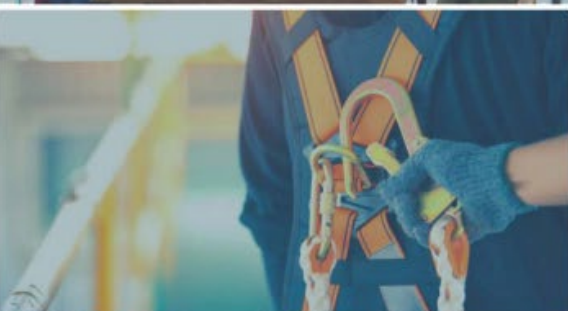

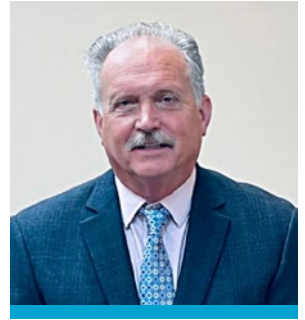

In 2020, Mr. Penney was appointed CEO of the Port of Argentia by the Board and has accepted the additional role and responsibility as a Director of Argentia Capital, a joint venture between the Port of Argentia and Torrent Capital.

Scott leads a team of professionals in the transformation to green hydrogen energy from wind power and spearheaded the Port into becoming the first monopile marshaling yard in North America. His dealings with oil and gas, marine transportation, energy, and logistics have made Scott an asset to the Port and its future.

Scott holds a Bachelor of Commerce Degree from Memorial University of Newfoundland. Scott began his career in telecommunications before becoming the Executive assistant to former Premier Dwight Ball. He then switched to oil and gas working on such projects as Hebron in Bull Arm and subsequently General Manager of a marine base in Newfoundland and Labrador.

He served as Board Chair of the of the Bay Bulls-Bauline Athletic Association, providing after school, summer programs, and raised over \$1 million dollars in recreation infrastructure investment to the seven surrounding communities.

Today Scott resides in Bay Bulls with his wife Jennifer and daughters Emma and Lauren.

CHARLENE JOHNSON

Charlene Johnson was a Member of the House of Assembly, Government of Newfoundland and Labrador, from 2003 to 2014. She was a senior cabinet minister in several departments including, Finance and Human Resource Secretariat, President of Treasury Board; Innovation, Business and Rural Development; Child, Youth and Family Services; and Environment and Conservation. She was also the minister responsible for the Status of Women and parliamentary secretary to the Minister of Natural Resources. Prior to the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador, Charlene worked as a policy analyst for the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board.

Following her time in provincial politics Charlene lived in Brunei. During her time overseas, she completed a Master of Business Administration (with Distinction) from Heriot Watt University in Edinburgh, Scotland. This complements her Bachelor of Science in forest engineering from the University of New Brunswick and Master of Applied Science in environmental engineering from Memorial University. The Honourable Dr. Andrew Furey was sworn in as Premier of Newfoundland and Labrador on August 19, 2020. He is also Leader of the Liberal Party of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Born and raised in Newfoundland and Labrador, Premier Dr. Andrew Furey is a passionate orthopaedic trauma surgeon and educator with Memorial University's School of Medicine.

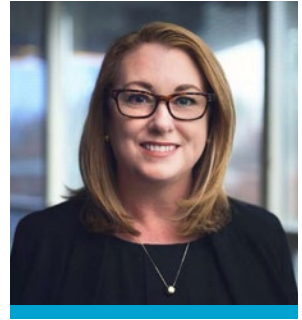
Premier Furey has a diverse education, which includes a Diploma in Organizational Leadership from Oxford University and a Masters in Clinical Epidemiology from Memorial. His strong work ethic has earned him many local, provincial, and national awards and honours. He was named Humanitarian of the Year by the Canadian Red Cross and earned the Governor General of Canada's Meritorious Service Cross.

In 2010, he helped create Team Broken Earth to provide medical relief after the devastating earthquake in Haiti. This Newfoundland and Labrador-born charity has since expanded in size and scope. Today, over 1,500 volunteers from across Canada, the US, and UK have participated in medical missions to Haiti as well as Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Guatemala, and Nicaragua. On top of that, Premier Furey helped found A Dollar A Day Foundation to support mental health initiatives across Canada.

Premier Furey enjoys spending time with his wife, Allison, and their children Maggie, Rachael and Mark. He credits his family for helping him stay grounded and maintain his perspective on what matters most – love, empathy, and making a difference.

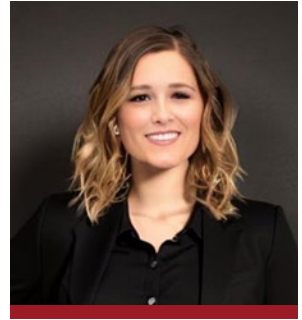

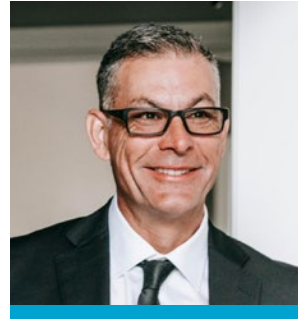

Metal and Auto Recycling Ltd.



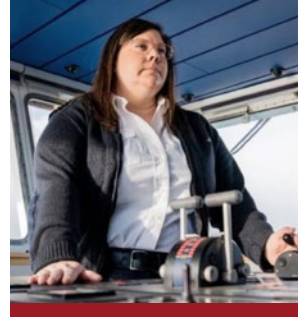

Braya Renewable Fuels (Newfoundland) LP



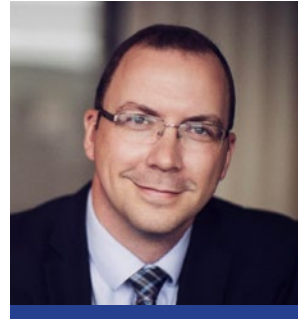
Jaydip Bhadaliya is manager and head of the Technical Services Department at Braya Renewable Fuels' Come By Chance refinery.

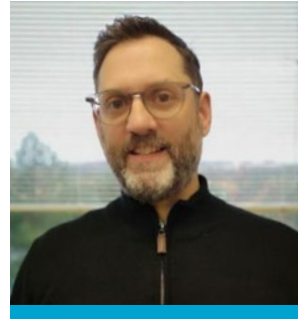

Specialist, Green Transition Fund

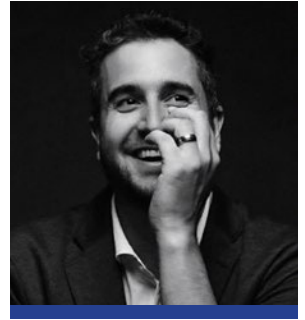

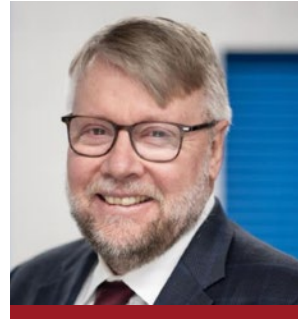

College of the North Atlantic



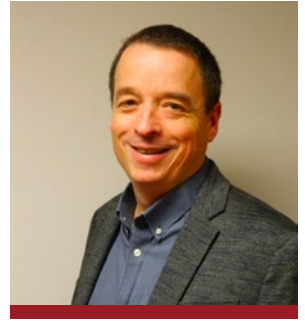

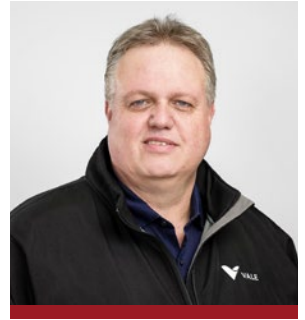

PIETER LOOCK

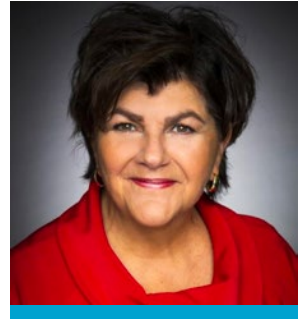
General Manager, Labrador Operations

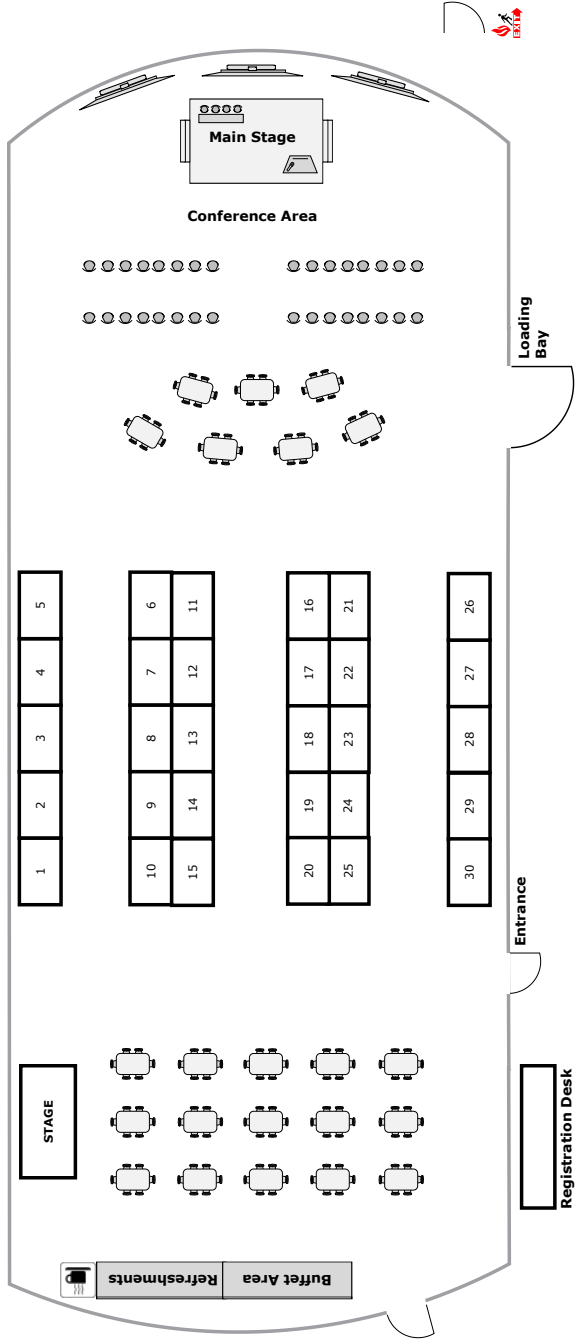
